

As the year began, students had high expectations. From


freshmen to seniors, students began a new journey of

## Ten Free Minutes


Break is the one time of the day that students and teachers look forward to most. It's a time to eat breakfast, get snacks, or just stand around and chat with friends.


# DressUp Days





















**Left:** President George W. Bush, whose main concentration for over a year has been the War with Iraq, turns his attention to the home front and announces his bid for re-election in 2004.




