#### <u>Universal Screening Grades K-8<sup>th</sup>, AIMS web, STAR Reading and STAR Math</u>

These benchmark assessments will be utilized to identify students whose performance warrants further investigation. They determine who is likely to need additional assistance to reach grade level performance expectations. Parents will receive notification if the results indicate the child meets the requirements for additional academic support and intervention(s). If the student qualifies for intervention, parents will be notified of the progress every 4.5 to 5 weeks.

**ACT** 

Beginning with the graduating class of 2018, students enrolled in Tennessee public schools

during their eleventh grade year must complete the ACT or SAT prior to graduation ( see High

School Policy 2.103). The students in Tennessee will have the opportunity to take a college

entrance exam in the familiar surroundings of their own school, on a school day, at no cost to

them. The test will be administered online.
